

When to Use

Site Availability: Dynamic and Hybrid

The Login page type is included by default each time a new site is created. This default login page is typically used by your Content Providers and other site management personnel. It is necessary to create additional login pages if personalized areas are added to a website.

Examples of when to use

Use the Login page type when you want to:

- ▶ Provide personalized content areas.
- ▶ Allow users to receive temporary passwords in order to login to the site.

Login Page Sections & Fields

| <i>Page Section</i> | <i>Field Name/Item</i> | <i>Description of usage</i> |
|-------------------------|-----------------------------------|---|
| Login Properties | Post Login Page | <p>Check this option to have a page other than the Home Page of the site open after a user has logged into the site.</p> <p>Click the <<Select Page>> hyperlink to view a site map and select the post login page.</p> |
| | Join Form Page | <p>Check this option to provide a "Join Form" hyperlink to an Application Form page on your website. Providing this link will allow site visitors to apply for a user account.</p> <p>Click the <<Select Page>> hyperlink to view a site map and select the Application Form.</p> |
| | Enable "Remember Username" | <p>Check this option to provide a Remember Username check box. Providing this check box will allow the Username to be stored and visible in the Username field of the login box.</p> |
| | Enable "Forgot Password" | <p>Check this option to provide a "Forgot Password" hyperlink. Providing this hyperlink will allow anyone with an active User Account to receive a temporary password by submitting their email address to the system.</p> |
| | Public Login | <p>Checking this box will change the Username label to "Email Address" in view mode and always use the internal database authenticator. This will allow public users to log in with their email and password.</p> |

| <i>Page Section</i> | <i>Field Name/Item</i> | <i>Description of usage</i> |
|-----------------------------|------------------------|--|
| Introduction Text | n/a | This editor window can contain text or graphics for your Login page and will appear above the Login box. You might use this area to enter text describing the properties that have been enabled and how to use them. |
| Conclusion Text | n/a | This editor window can contain text or graphics for your Login page and will appear below the Login box. You might use this area to enter text notifying users of where they will be directed once logged in to the website. |
| Forgot Password Text | n/a | If the Enable Forgot Password property is enabled this customizable text will appear in the area where the email address is submitted in order to receive a temporary password. |

Advanced Layout Options

The Advanced Layout Options allows you to format the View and Forgot Password layouts.

Using the Advanced Layout Options you can change table sizes, reposition IronPoint tags and identify the styles used within the page.

Login Page Tips!

- ▶ Each site is **required** to have a **default Login page**. The default Login page can be changed at any time in the Sites Manager > Edit Site > Site Variables settings.
- ▶ If you attempt to **archive a Login Page** or **make a Login page inactive**, you will receive a message that a new default Login page must first be selected.
- ▶ If you don't want Login pages to be included in search results (from the ACM search page type), shown in site maps, or published with a static site, all of these options can be enabled from the Page Type Manager > Page Type Details settings.
